

Seniors, juniors and sophomores may arrive at any time during their window; the process will last less than 30 minutes. Freshmen and their parents should arrive no later than 6pm so they can attend the entire orientation and registration process; we will finish about 8pm.

NEW!!! The registration process has been improved this year. You may take care of **course registrations fees online** using your *Infinite Campus Parent Portal* and paying by credit card. By printing your online receipt you get the “fast pass” through the waiting line and will directly receive your schedule. We are no longer accepting credit cards at school; please pay online. We will still have a time for registration at school so students can complete some other items before school starts:

Atherton's Rebel History

With the recent media attention on rebel mascots across our nation, I wanted to share with you some historical information retrieved from our school archives:

*Prior to 1950, Atherton High student body was female only. The formation of a field hockey team was opposed by Emma Woerner, the principal (from 1923-1955). When the team was finally formed, the name **Rebels** was chosen because of the previous opposition.*

*In 1950 the school became coeducational. All of the athletic teams subsequently formed were known as **Rebels**. The school colors were **Mulberry and Gold**.*

*By 1969 the student body had become desegregated. **Rebels** remained the team name and the Confederate Flag was used to substantiate the Rebel cause. Minority students objected vehemently.*

*By 1971 confrontation status had been reached. An apparent compromise eased the situation. A caricature of a **Revolutionary Rebel** became the school symbol. The use of the confederate flag was abolished. The school colors became **Maroon and Gold**.*

At registration, all students and parents will have the opportunity to join the **Atherton Parent Teacher Student Organization (PTSTO)** for \$10 dollars each or \$20 for family membership (check made to *Atherton PTSTO*). A strong PTSTO is vital to the success of our school. Our PTSTO works diligently to serve our school, staff, and students. They also provide a venue for staff and student appreciation during registration, open houses, parent-teacher conferences, holidays and special events. The Atherton PTSTO awards scholarships to deserving seniors each year. We need the support of the every parent, student, and staff for the PTSTO to remain strong. Please be sure to join and support the students and staff of our school. The PTSTO also provide an Atherton Spirit Cup for each membership and three cups for a family membership!

School Testing

Atherton students have performed phenomenally on all state testing. Our staff direct learning activities around critical thinking skills every day and they assess students to demonstrate mastery of subject content; this higher-level learning approach has transferred effectively into success on standardized tests that are used for accountability. Our school results from last year are not yet finalized, but the predictor data are that we are expected to set another year of unprecedented results from our kids! School results will certainly be communicated as they become available.

Cell Phone Policy

In keeping up with this current state of digital devices, the Atherton SBDM Council, Atherton PTSTO and the Principal's Advisory Committee revised Atherton's **Cell Phone Policy** to encourage the appropriate and responsible use of cell phones. Please be aware of our rules on this issue and support your child's adherence to the reasonable limitations of use of electronic devices:

Before/After School:

Students may use cell phones and headphones/earbuds before 7:40am and after 2:20pm.

During School:

Students may access cell phones without headphones/earbuds during the instructional day in **common areas such as the hallway, cafeteria and courtyard.**

Students may not access cell phones in class unless authorized by the teacher for instructional purposes.

Parent Leaders: Consider the SBDM or PTSTO

During all registrations, the PTSTO will conduct parent elections for two parent-representative vacancies on the **Atherton School Based Decision Making (SBDM) Council**. Voting will take place at the school during the registration process. You should have already received a letter in our summer mailing from the PTSTO describing the nomination process. SBDM parent nominations are due back to the school received/postmarked no later than **August 1**. I encourage any of our parents to nominate yourself or other parents who wish to take an active role at Atherton through participation in the PTSTO and/or serving on the SBDM Council; both groups officially meet only once per month.

Make Your Mark on Campus: School Wide Beautification Days

On Wednesday, August 5 and Tuesday, August 11, 2015 (the day before school starts) we will hold a school wide beautification/clean up day. Everyone is invited to participate. Please wear gloves and bring lawn mowers, weed eaters, rakes, flat-head shovels, tree trimmers...anything you can think of to help spruce up our beautiful campus. On both days the work party will start at 6:00 pm and end at dark. We will meet in the student parking lot. Atherton Athletic News From the Athletic Director

Great things are happening with Rebel athletics!!!

*Fall sports tryouts for boys and girls cross country, field hockey, football, boys' and girls' golf, boys' and girls' soccer and volleyball will begin on **July 15**. Any student interested in trying out must have a current Sports Physical Packet on file with the Athletic Director. You can find copies of the packet on our website or you can pick one up in the front office. There is also a \$5.00 insurance fee that must be paid prior to tryouts and an additional \$15.00 if the student makes the team. **It is very important that you have all of your paperwork turned in and you attend tryouts on the first day. E-mail the coach immediately if you have any questions.** Attached is a listing of our coaches.

*Adult and student athletic season passes will be sold at all student registrations. The pass allows entrance to all fall, winter, and spring home sporting events (freshman, JV, and/or varsity). The student pass also gets the student in to both the football and basketball homecoming dances. An adult pass is only \$50.00 and a student pass is \$40.00. What a deal!!!

Suicide Prevention Awareness

I'd like to inform you that during the first weeks of school we will be conducting a lesson with all students about suicide prevention. This lesson will include a video presentation and a teacher-led discussion. Students will be asked to complete a short form to indicate whether they would like to talk to an adult about a concern for themselves or someone else. We will have our guidance counselors and additional trained professionals available to meet individually with any students who express a need for such support. If any significant concerns arise with your child, we will contact you immediately.

In accordance to state law, all students in Kentucky middle and high schools must receive information on suicide prevention by September 1 of each school year. If your child is absent on the day we are conducting our lesson, a makeup lesson will be provided upon his/her return. All of the suicide prevention programs we use have been thoroughly researched and carefully selected. Staff members in our school are also provided with training annually, so that they can properly conduct the lessons and respond to any student needs that may arise. If you have questions or concerns about this topic, or would like further information, please contact your child's counselor.

TWOFOUR Broadcast Company

Last year, Atherton was considered for participation in an TV documentary project. We have been notified that Atherton was not chosen from the three national finalists, but we are honored to have progressed so far in the selection process and still may be considered in the future. **TwoFour Broadcast**, a production company that has won an international Emmy for its hit series *Educating Yorkshire*, has been asked by a United States television company to look for schools in the US that might be interested in participating. The ambition of this series is to produce a collection of warm, honest and important documentary programs which will capture the experiences of both staff and a diverse range of students. They hope that these will be optimistic and celebratory films which sensitively explore the human relationships that lie at the heart of school life. Class Officer Elections

Information was brought to the attention of the Atherton administration concerning the end-of-year class officer elections. The investigation into these claims has confirmed that there were mistakes made in decision-making by the school administration. These mistakes include the procedure of assuring student representation, ballot handling and ballot tabulation.

Current ballots for the freshman slates reflect that only 123 of the current 403 freshman voted, leaving a majority of our 9th grade students under represented. The sophomore and junior classes had adequate numbers of students participating in voting; however the ballot handling and tabulation procedures were not appropriately conducted.

Although no accusations of misconduct have been brought forth, the incorrect implementation of ballot-handling procedures does result in significant concerns of the election's validity.

Therefore, in an effort to ensure the student body's voice is heard and to preserve the integrity of student leadership and class unity, we have decided to nullify the election results announced on Thursday, June 4th, due to the school administration's error. Class officer elections will now be held during the first month of school, beginning next year as well as for future years. Class officer slates for all grade levels will be arranged, managed and handed directly to an administrator for secure tabulation. Slates for all grade levels will have to be approved again prior to the September elections.

The election of class officers is taken seriously and it is our hope that all students will participate in this democratic process. The decision to redo this election did not come easily. Our intent is to provide accurate and unquestionable election results with safe guards that were not previously in place.

Parent guide -- free downloads by topic or borrow a book from your child's teacher! The Parent Guides for *Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra 2 Connections* discuss the main ideas of each unit, offer additional examples, and solve key problems in detail. Each book also contains hundreds of additional practice problems (with answers). The *Algebra 2 Connections* Guide includes SAT-type practice sets.

Homework Help - The CPM website offers 24/7 on-line help for the homework portion of each CPM lesson for the *Algebra, Geometry & Algebra 2 Connections* and for *Pre-Calculus with Trigonometry*. The help is tutorial in nature so that students can learn how to use the mathematics necessary to solve the problems. **Go to the Student Support menu to click on the Homework Help tab.** Choose the appropriate book title. The site runs better using Safari or Firefox (free download available at the site). Google Translate will help you in different languages.

E-books - Parent e-book licenses are now available! All of the above resources can be accessed through the full student edition e-book including a dictionary, Google translate feature, homework help and technology apps. Governor's Scholars Program- Begin Preparing NOW

Did you know that the average college **scholarship** for students accepted into the Governor's Scholars program is **\$68,000**? Last year, students accepted into this program with an ACT of 28 were automatically accepted with **full paid tuition** to the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville! **Atherton has averaged about 5 Governor's Scholars every year since 2000!** Governor's Scholars are students with strong academic achievements who demonstrate leadership, citizenship and volunteerism. The program application process is open to **juniors** every

November, **but all underclassmen can begin building the experiences NOW** for an attractive application! Have your child journal all the great things they do in the school and outside of the school; awards and recognitions include any type of honor in which the student or student work was individually recognized. Governor's School for the Arts

The GSA is an arts education program of *The Kentucky Center for the Performing Arts* that provides arts training through a free three-week summer residential program that instructs students in one of nine art forms. GSA is open to ALL students and does not consider GPA or other academic measures in the application review process. Because GSA alumni are talented and driven individuals who want to make a difference in their communities, 21 colleges and universities offer **scholarship** opportunities to GSA alumni. National Merit Scholarship Program

The National Merit Scholarship Program is an annual academic competition among high school students for recognition and college scholarships. Recipients may receive **thousands of dollars** in scholarships directly from the National Merit Program and often receive substantial scholarships from universities who are looking to attract the nation's brightest students. Students who perform exceptionally on the **PSAT** are **invited by the National Merit Foundation to apply** for the National Merit Scholarship. Learn more at www.nationalmerit.org.

VOGT Scholarship

The Vogt Achievement Scholarship was established by Henry V. Heuser to award a **\$10,000 scholarship annually to one graduating senior who qualifies at each Jefferson County public high school.**

Criteria includes:

- Student must be a **senior** on track to graduate from a Jefferson County Public High School.
- Score of 25 or higher on the ACT or 1150 or higher on the SAT. Students with lower scores, but a cumulative GPA of 3.2, may be considered.
- Completed high school coursework in JCPS Advanced Program, College Board Advanced Placement or a pre-college curriculum.
- Demonstrated leadership abilities in community service, co-curricular extra-curricular activities, or school activities.

Application deadlines are in November each year; seniors may obtain and return applications directly to the school via the senior counselor.

PREPARE FOR THE ACT AND EOC EXAMS

TCA for the ACT - To assist students in preparing for the ACT and the End-of-Course (E.O.C.) exams, Atherton has purchased the Triumph College Admissions (TCA) program for all students as a method to support student academic achievement and growth. Every year, all juniors and sophomores complete a practice ACT assessment and freshmen take the practice PLAN (pre-ACT) assessment. Students will continue to have access to this program through the end of their senior year. These results have been sent to TCA and the data will help each student individually identify areas of strength and growth before they take the ACT. Each year, the practice ACT is a different version than the one used in the previous year for this annual Atherton event so your child is continuing to be exposed to opportunities to grow academically and work specifically on "critical skills" as determined by the achievement on these practice tests.

Every student can use their student identification number from school (you can find this on any report card, on IC Portal, or students can get this in the library) as their personal login name and password to the TCA web-based program. Students are encouraged to practice academic skills at home, before or after school, and teachers may use this program to target specific Quality Core academic standards as a supplement to their current instruction. With as little as ten hours of individualized instruction on the TCA program,

students may ACT see gains of three (3) points or greater! We recommend a simple of commitment of just one hour per week to unlock your child's fullest potential.

Again, each student's login username and password will both be the student's "school identification number" which can be obtained in the library and can also be found directly under the student's name when you log into Infinite Campus portal.

Free ACT Preparation Classes through the Louisville Free Public Library!

In addition to the more personalized TCA program offered through the school, I hope you take advantage of these opportunities through the Louisville Free Public Library (www.lfpl.org). Access only requires a library card which can be ordered for free through any public library.

When your child returns to school, please send her/him with a note that includes:

- Grade
- Date of absence/tardy
- REASON for absence/tardy
- Parent/Guardian best contact number (home/cell/work)
- Parent/Guardian signature.

This information is necessary when we receive our regular attendance audits. If your child is absent more than two consecutive days, please also provide a copy of a physician's statement for the reason of absence. Students absent ten or more days will be required to submit a physician's statement for every absence thereafter to excuse further absences.

Check your child's tardies and absences under the Attendance tab on the left side of Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Any unexcused events should be rectified immediately. Remind your child to turn in any notes that you give her/him to first period teacher.

District Attendance Policy

In accordance with district policy, if a student is **absent 10 or more times** the school will require a doctor's note to excuse any further absence. A student with an ongoing illness may request an exemption with doctor's approval. Please remember this every time you are absent also if you have more than 9 unexcused absences and you are 16 or 17 you will not be able to get or keep your driver's permit.

Driving: No Pass No Drive Law

Attention Students About to Get a Drivers License

State legislature passed a law that requires students to maintain satisfactory grades and attendance to obtain a driver's permit/license. Students cannot receive a permit or driver's license unless they have fewer than **9 unexcused absences** and passing at least **5 of 7 courses**.

Students are required to present the COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY SCHOOL COMPLIANCE VERIFICATION FOR DRIVER LICENSING KRS 159.051 form to the Department of Motor Vehicles upon applying for a driver's permit/license. Contact the Attendance Office to obtain the form or for more details.

Immunizations

In accordance with the immunization laws of Kentucky, ALL STUDENTS are required to have a current Kentucky immunization on file as well as a completed Preventative Examination Form (JCPS requirement for grades 5 through 12). You may turn them in to the counseling office.


